SEDE VACANTE: The Coat of Arms above is the symbol used for the papacy when the Seat is Vacant. With the resignation of Pope Benedict, there is no one to occupy the Seat of Peter and so the Miter is replaced by a Umbrella, an ancient symbol for the Vatican. Historic Times: A Reflection. Like you I was surprised to hear of the resignation of Pope Benedict but it made sense that a man who so loved the church wanted to have a “Peter” in the barque of the church with his hand on the rudder who would have the strength to guide it in these turbulent times. I have had a chance to read much of what Benedict wrote and spoke over the past several weeks. His talk to the clergy of Rome was a brilliant summation of the documents of Vatican II. And he contrasted the two councils that went on at Vatican II. There was the council that took place among the world’s pastors as they tried to figure out how to preach and teach the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the modern world. There was the parallel council made up of the media who had another agenda. And the Church became influenced by this other council almost more than the one among the pastors. Benedict spoke of Jesus as the true Shepherd and that the gates of hell shall not prevail against. This confidence and trust in Jesus led him to this momentous decision.

As I write this reflection the Cardinals have all arrived in Rome. All their General Congregations have been concluded and now they wait for the mass of the Holy Spirit on Tuesday of this week. Then they go into the Sistine Chapel and vote. As you read this, we more than likely will have a new Pope. The Church has been blest to have so many holy men lead her during the last century. Pius X, a canonized saint who, becoming Pope in 1903, led us into the last century and Blessed John Paul II who led us into this one, make the point that it is holiness that we all must strive after. Holiness for a Pope and holiness for a pew-dweller is the same thing...it’s made up of an intimate walk with the Lord each and every day of our lives. May the Lord shine his light of wisdom and mercy on this new Pope and may we as Catholics find our faith renewed as well under his guidance.

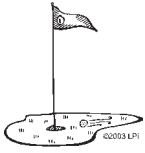
