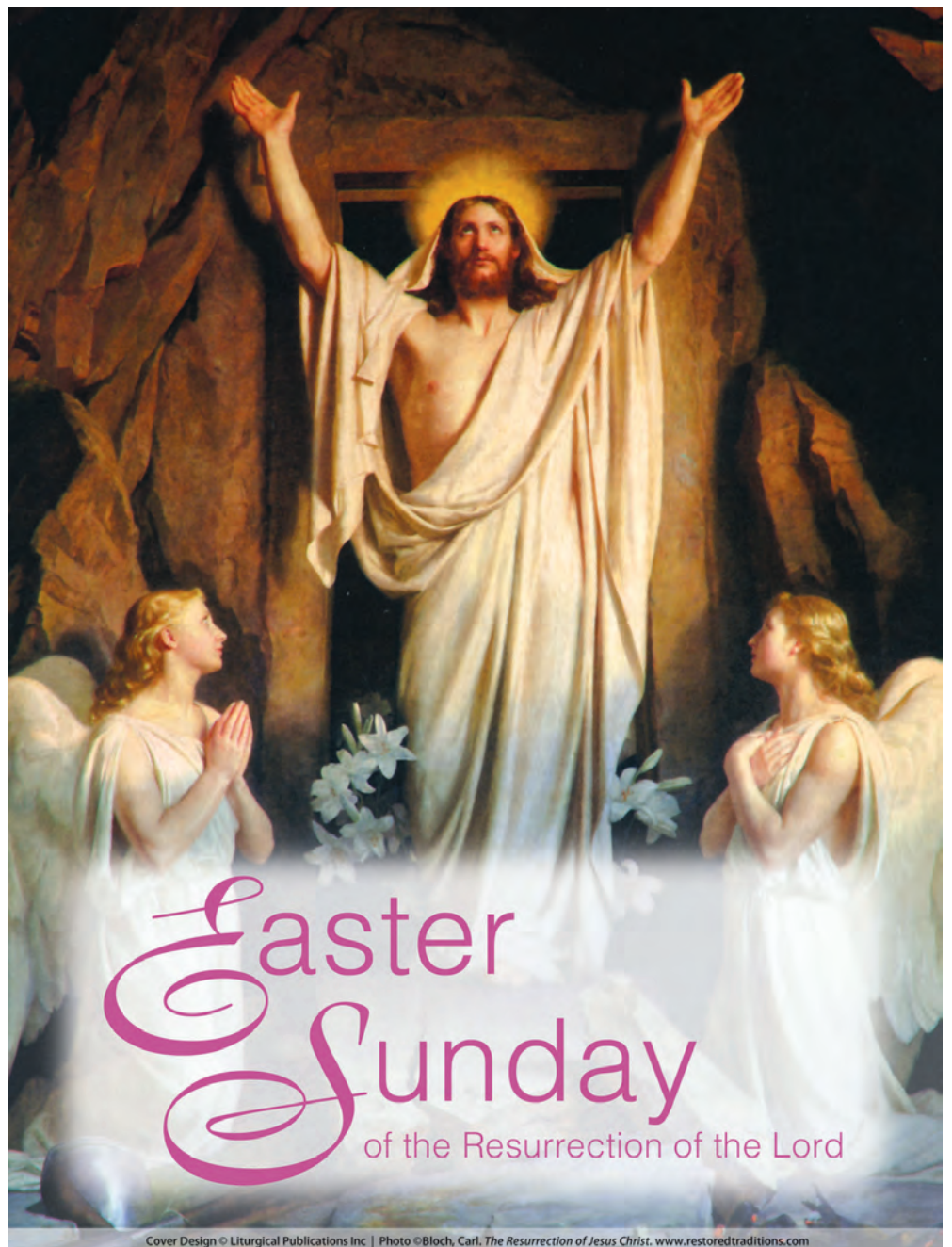

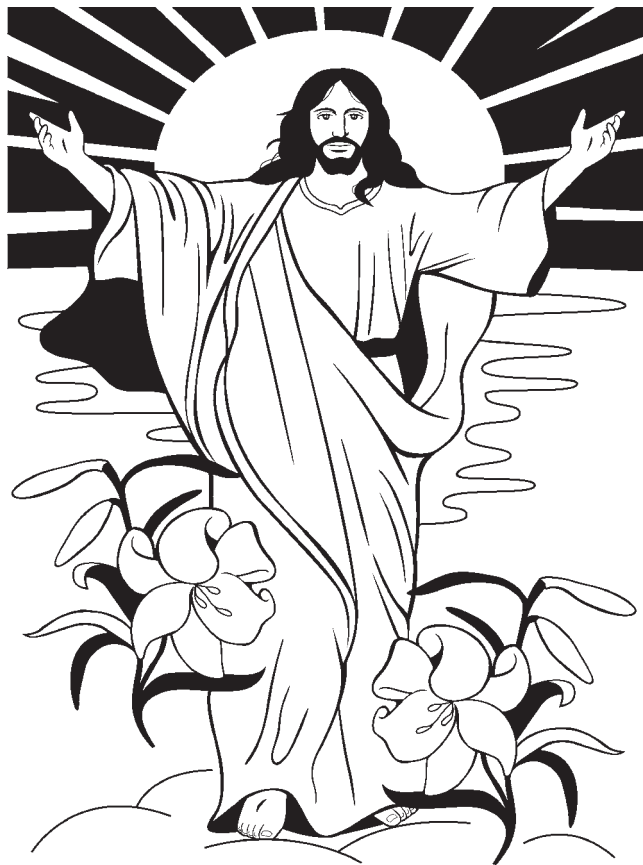
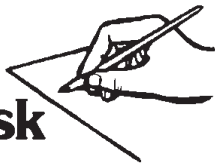

## From the Pastor's Desk



### **Surrexit Dominus: The Lord is Risen!! Alleluia!!:**

I wish you all a joy that no one can take from you, a joy based on the hard-won truth that our lives have a meaning and purpose that goes beyond the grave and this is the free gift conferred on us who believe in the resurrection of our Lord. I hope your lent has come to a wonderful conclusion as the purples give way to the gold and whites of Easter, in our environment and in our hearts.

**First Communion is coming:** Right on the heels of Easter will be our Celebrations of First Holy Communion and Confirmation. As I wrote about already in the bulletin... we will hold our First Communions at the 9:00 am and 12:00 noon masses on the two Sundays following Easter. This will mean these masses will be crowded. I have asked the KC's to help with the parking lot to move cars as quickly as possible. Parents and their children will be asked to be in the Hall 30 minutes prior to the start of the mass. A group picture will be taken 15 minutes before mass. After mass pictures can be taken in the hall, not in church. It will be wonderful

two weekends to continue the joyous celebration of Easter which lasts for 50 days anyway.

**Confirmation:** In the midst of our parish's First Communions is our Celebration of Confirmation by Archbishop Lucas. This celebration will take place on Saturday, April 13 at 7:00 pm. Please say a prayer for our 8<sup>th</sup> graders and their families as they commit themselves to an active Catholic Faith.

**Walk With Pride:** Our School's Annual Appeal which benefits the work of our Home and School and directly impacts the educational program in our school, will soon take place. Our students are now sending out their communication asking for your participation. It's a high and lofty goal but if we make \$70,000 then Mr. Garland and I will be coming out to a special school assembly wearing specially school uniforms made from the same plaid that you see in the girls dresses. It would be quite the site. In the past Walk With Pride has made well over \$45,000. Support your school.

**Pray for our Religious Formation Program:** We have entered into a discernment phase with our program. We are looking at a major change that would impact our families in a most tremendous way. If parents are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith then why isn't our program (in fact all our catechetical programs) centered around the family? And why isn't our prime mission to help parents build a faith community among themselves while at the same time giving them the tools to actually teach their children. We have to find a way to impact families because this is where faith is caught and taught and the Church has to concentrate her energies on them. 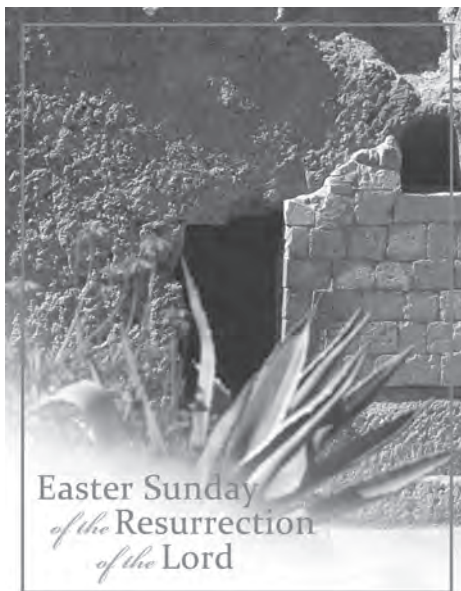

### New Pope Francis Called Abortion the "Death Penalty for the Unborn"

The archbishop of Buenos Aires, Jorge Mario Bergoglio, has been selected to become the next Pope, leading the Catholic Church. Like his predecessors, Pope Benedict XVI and Pope John Paul II, he is a staunch pro-life advocate when it comes to abortion. He once called abortion a "death sentence" for unborn children, during a 2007 speech and likening opposition to abortion to opposition to the death penalty. "we should commit ourselves to 'Eucharistic coherence', that is, we should be conscious that people cannot receive holy communion and at the same time act or speak against the commandments, in particular when abortion, euthanasia, and other serious crimes against life and family are facilitated.
