IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Baptisms

You must be a registered parishioner and attend one baptism class. This class is held the second Thursday of every month. Please fill out the form found in the kiosk of the church and return the form to the business office to sign up for the class. The form MUST be completed and turned in the Tuesday before the Baptism class. If not turned in by this deadline, you will attend the following class. This is not a walk-in class.

Marriage

According to the Archdiocesan guidelines and to ensure adequate preparation for this very important Sacrament, you must make arrangements at least six (6) months ahead of the Marriage date. Special instructions are required for any Catholic party under 19 years of age. No date can be set for this marriage. A Civil Marriage License should be obtained two weeks in advance of marriage. To set a wedding date here at St. Gerald Catholic Church, you must be a registered parishioner for 3 months.

Religious Formation: K-8

Children of the parish are supplied with Religious Formation either in our 5-day school or in our Religious Formation Program. Regular and sustained Religious Formation is a life-long process. Parental support at home for their children's religious formation includes attendance at the Sunday Eucharist, prayer at home, and support of the catechetical program of their choice. Parishioners who homeschool are encouraged to visit with the Religious Formation Director about their children's preparations for the sacraments.

Registration in the Parish

If you attend St. Gerald then it is important that you register. You can easily do this by simply attending a Welcome Registration session that is held in the Parish Library on the First and Third Sundays of the Month following the 10:30 am Mass.



Many Many Thanks: The parish of St. Gerald is indeed so generous. Thank you for your

donations to the Holy Land Franciscans who staff and work at all the holy places in the Holy Land. I met a number of these men and I can safely tell you that they live a life of simplicity and welcome as they deal with the thousands of pilgrims who come to the Holy Land to visit the places where Jesus walked. They also help with many social services to the poor in and around these sites. You donated almost \$5000 (\$4,928.53) to help their work.

Corpus Christi Procession: The feast of Corpus Christi (The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ) which is always the second Sunday after Pentecost...this year it is June 2, is always an opportunity for us to honor Jesus in the Eucharist. The Church has always encouraged a procession of the Blessed Sacrament on this day; this encouragement did not go away after Vatican II—it just got talked down by those who thought they knew better. We have had processions here at St. Gerald's most notably when we processed with the Blessed Sacrament from our church on Lakeview to the New St. Gerald's on 96th and Q when we began using the new church. Last year we processed around the church at 96th and Q. For Totus Tuus the kids and their youth catechists and any who want to join them, have a procession around the school building. Honoring Jesus in such a physical way helps to bolster our faith and even lets others see it...for it is not hidden by the walls of a church. I am proposing that we hold a procession this year from one of our churches to the other. We have such an ideal situation with our two churches and a nice quiet street to process on in between. I am further proposing we do this on a Saturday evening, June 1, beginning at 6:30 pm followed by a social for all the participants. Those of all ages can come and be part of this--rides will be provided for those who can't walk that far and a shuttle will be provided to get people back to their cars at the other site.

*Special participant invitations: First Communicants come in First Communion Attire (no need for veils and wear your good outdoor walking shoes), you lead the procession (with parents); Cub and Boy Scouts—come in uniform; Daisies, Brownies and Girl Scouts—come in uniform

*All parish organizations are encouraged to come, join in, make a banner to carry proclaiming your group (Choir, Knights of Columbus, Liturgy Committee, Men's Club, School—specific class, etc...)
*Children: make ribbon banners: 6 to 8 three foot multicolored ribbons attached to a dowel that is about 2' long.
*Omaha Police will provide safety: car in front and car in the rear. KC's will provide special honor guard. Men of the parish will carry the canopy. Priests and Deacons will carry the Monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament and preside at the various prayer\altar stops along

the way.

*Procession begins at the Lakeview Chapel and will wind its way along Lakeview Street across 84th to Lakeview Drive to 90th then a jog over to Mockingbird Drive ending up at 96th and O.

*Families along the way can volunteer their home for a stop helping to prepare an outdoor make-shift altar...prayers will be said and the procession will move on.

*Fliers will be distributed the week prior telling all people along the way what this is that will be passing their way. We are advertising this city-wide so invite your friends from neighboring parishes.

*Only a month off.

May Crowning: The Final mass for Religious Education will be held at 96th and Q on Wednesday, May 1 at 6:15 pm. We will have a May Crowning at this mass. We will be using the statue that was purchased by the Grade School children and the Religious Ed children. The Grade School May Crowning Mass will be at 8:15 am on Friday, May 10. Thanks to Ron Szatko for re-creating our shrine platform for the new statue. Eventually a wall shelf shrine will be constructed for the Hall where this statue will normally be kept.

Clergy Appreciation: On Friday, May 3rd, all the clergy of the parish: priests and deacons along with the religious Sisters of our parish...will have a party in their honor hosted by the Knights of Columbus. Anyone can attend this event. But you need to let them know you are coming. Contact Mike D'Ercole at mttercole@cox.net and let him know you want to come. It is always a nice evening. I have it in my calendar that it begins at 6:00 pm in the Dorsey Hall at Church.

Pray for our Religious Formation Program: We have entered into a discernment phase with our program. We are looking at a major change that would impact our families in a most tremendous way. If parents are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith then why isn't our program (in fact all our catechetical programs) centered around the family? And why isn't our prime mission to help parents build a faith community among themselves while at the same time giving them the tools to actually teach their children. We have to find a way to impact families because this is where faith is caught and taught and the Church has to concentrate her energies on them. The by-product are young people who not only learn but have fun with their faith. Check out the following website for more information: www.familyformation.net

*So far, two trips have been taken to Norfolk to observe the program that we are contemplating. It comes out of a parish in Ham Lake, MN. Fr. Tim Nolan was the founder of the program and as one of my seminary advisors when I was in college I have great respect for his holiness and desire to renew the church with Catholics committed and excited about their faith. The secular and now, anti-Christian culture will take us and our families down if we don't figure out how to rely on a

family—at church.

*A much better way to talk about Faith formation for our youth is to call it Family Formation. It's the parents that really matter. Parents can teach their kids to play softball, they can teach their kids to wash clothes, make their bed, even cook. Parents will become scout leaders, volunteer coaches and will help them do their homework. Why not also actively teach their children about one of the most important possessions of their lives....their religion...and by example they share their love for God.

*Mary Harper has begun meeting with small groups of parents from the program to present the possible change to them and get their input. Change is always a challenge but the fear of change is not enough to keep one from choosing a way that will deliver the gospel in a renewed way...it's all part of what is called the New Evangeliza-
