IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Baptisms

You must be a registered parishioner and attend one baptism class. This class is held the second Thursday of every month. Please fill out the form found in the kiosk of the church and return the form to the business office to sign up for the class. **The form MUST be completed and turned in the Tuesday before the Baptism class.** If not turned in by this deadline, you will attend the following class. This is not a walk-in class.

Marriage

According to the Archdiocesan guidelines and to ensure adequate preparation for this very important Sacrament, you must make arrangements at least six (6) months ahead of the Marriage date. Special instructions are required for any Catholic party under 19 years of age. No date can be set for this marriage. A Civil Marriage License should be obtained two weeks in advance of marriage. ***To set a wedding date here at St. Gerald Catholic Church, you must be a registered parishioner for 3 months.***

Religious Formation: K-8

Children of the parish are supplied with Religious Formation either in our 5-day school or in our Religious Formation Program. Regular and sustained Religious Formation is a life-long process. Parental support at home for their children's religious formation includes attendance at the Sunday Eucharist,

Corpus Christi Procession: The feast of Corpus Christi (The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ) which is always the second Sunday after Pentecost...this year it is June 2, is always an opportunity for us to honor Jesus in the Eucharist. The Church has always encouraged a procession of the Blessed Sacrament on this day. We will have our own parish Corpus Christi Procession on a **Saturday evening, June 1, beginning at 6:30 pm** followed by an Ice Cream social for all the participants. Those of all ages can come and be part of this---rides will be provided for those who can't walk that far and a shuttle will be provided to get people back to their cars at the other site.

Special participant invitations: First Communicants come in First Communion Attire (no need for veils and wear your good outdoor walking shoes); Cub and Boy Scouts—come in uniform; Daisies, Brownies and Girl Scouts—come in uniform
All parish organizations are encouraged to come, join in, make a banner to carry proclaiming your group (Choir, Knights of Columbus, Liturgy Committee, Men's Club, School—specific class, etc...)

Omaha Police will provide safety. KC's will provide special honor guard. Men of the parish will carry the canopy. Priests and Deacons will carry the Monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament and preside at the various prayer/altar stops along the way.

Procession begins at the Lakeview Chapel and will wind its way along Lakeview Street across 84th to Lakeview Drive to 90th then a jog over to Mockingbird Drive ending up at 96th and Q.

Once we get the stops nailed down we will publish these and you can meet us at one of them and join the procession as it winds it's way to the Church.

Fliers will be distributed the week prior telling all people along the way what this will be passing their way. Girl Scouts will help with this.

We are advertising this city-wide so invite your friends from neighboring parishes.

Parishioners who specialize in drapery are making our own parish Canopy that will be used in the procession. All the servers of the parish are invited to come along....when we run out of albs, hope we do, we are going to have you carry Tiki Lamps in the procession, is that cool or not,...maybe taking turns carrying them.

The prayer booklet is about finished and we are planning on praying a decade of the rosary as well as a Litany between each of the stopping points along the route. In addition we are planning on some recorded music (from our choir). There will also be silence too...just to walk along quietly.

Hospitality – The First Pillar of Stewardship

Many years ago our parish began a stewardship model started by the Diocese of Wichita, KS. This model describes stewardship of a parish relying on four pillars (*in this order*): **Hospitality, Prayer, Formation and Service.**

Hospitality is the first pillar because the spirituality of stewardship presupposes a disciple who comes to church. By attending Mass we make ourselves receptive to the graces that Jesus showers upon us by studying his sayings through the **Liturgy of the Word**, and through receiving His once-for-all sacrifice in the **Liturgy of the Eucharist.**

Greeters open the door and welcome people with a smile. Ushers help worshippers find a place to sit. So . . . we've got this pillar covered, don't we?

Not so fast – hospitality is the responsibility of everyone at Mass, not just the Greeters and Ushers. We can smile at others we see, particularly those whom we do not already know. We can scoot into a pew to make room for people arriving after us. We can visit with strangers in the Narthex after Mass, or on Doughnut Sunday.

Hospitality is not just a good idea to develop a parish filled with stewards – it's also a direct command from Sacred Scripture – take a look at these verses to hear the very voice of God speaking to you: Hebrews 13:2 and Matthew 25:38-45 and 1st Peter 4:9.
